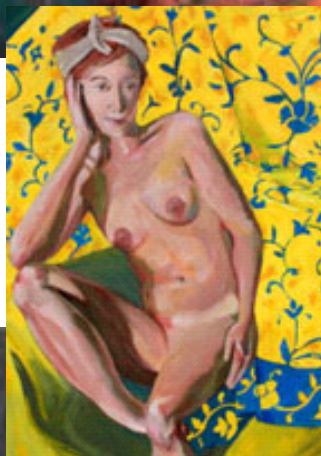
## AAPR Festival special 2011
